

BAD BEAT JACKPOT

OFFICIAL RULES

- A promotional dollar is extracted from each Texas Hold'Em Bad Beat Jackpot if/when the pot reaches a minimum amount of \$15. The Bad Beat Jackpot may be capped at a predetermined amount determined by management.
- All promotional funds extracted are paid out to poker patrons via the Bad Beat Jackpot and/or Bad Beat promotional events.
- Texas Hold'Em games that extract a promotional dollar are exclusively eligible for the Bad Beat Jackpot and all Bad Beat promotional prize awards.
- The current Bad Beat Jackpot amount is updated and displayed daily in the Poker Room.
- "Bad Beat" means: Qualifying high-ranking poker hand that is beaten by a higher-ranking hand.
- A minimum of five players must be dealt in at the start of the hand in order to qualify.
- For the jackpot to take effect, the two hole cards must play from both the winning and the losing hand. In case of Quads, you must have pair in hand.
- Hole cards must beat the board. If there is a tie, the board plays.
- In the event that there is more than one qualifying Bad Beat hand, only the second-best hand (the top-qualifying Bad Beat hand) will be paid.
- The hand must go to showdown in order to qualify for the Bad Beat Jackpot, and eligible hands must be turned face-up on the table.
- Players must not owe any missed blinds to be awarded a portion of the Bad Beat Jackpot when it hits.
- Winners must have a valid photo ID to claim prize and are responsible for all applicable taxes.

Approximate payouts for the Bad Beat are as follows:

- 50% of the Bad Beat main pot will be awarded to the Bad Beat hand (losing Texas Hold'Em hand).
- 25% of the Bad Beat main pot will be awarded to the winner of the Texas Hold'Em hand.
- 25% of the Bad Beat main pot will be awarded equally amongst the other players at the table.

Bad Beat Jackpot may be void in the event of the following:

- Discussion of the hand while in play, or any comments regarding potential Bad Beat hands, are prohibited and will result in the disqualification of the hand being a Bad Beat Jackpot hand.
- Cards leaving clear view of the table at any time.
- Cards dealt out of sequence.
- Too many or too few burn cards.
- Foul deck or too many or too few cards.

Jackpot qualifying hands and calculations:

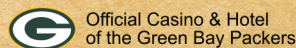
- Every time the Bad Beat Jackpot is paid out, a new Bad Beat Jackpot will begin at an amount designated by the Poker Room.
- The qualifying Bad Beat hand is four 2's beat.

All Bad Beat funds collected are allocated into three tiers:

- 50% to the Bad Beat main jackpot
- 25% to the Bad Beat reserve jackpot
- 25% to the Bad Beat promotional event fund

All funds collected/allocated are awarded via the Bad Beat Jackpot award and/or Bad Beat promotional events.
